The Capital Area Coalition on Homelessness (CACH), which is the collaborative applicant for CoC PA501, will utilize planning funds for the following activities:

- Design and carry out the collaborative process for the application to HUD
- Prepare and submit the CoC's application for CoC Program funds
- Evaluate the outcomes of projects funded through CoC and ESG program grants
- Participate in the Consolidated Plan(s) process of the jurisdictions within the City of Harrisburg and County of Dauphin

- Conduct sheltered and unsheltered Point-in-Time counts
- Monitor recipients and sub-recipients compliance with program Requirements

The planning activities are ongoing and continual annual activities.

The preparation and submission of CoC application and collaborative process will take place when HUD releases the NOFA in 2018 for the next round of applications.

Outcome evaluation for HUD SHP funded projects will be conducted annually, and since the individual projects have varying dates of APR submission, the annual date for collection of APRs for review will be fixed to the month of the CoC submission.

Evaluation of ESG project outcome will be conducted in August of each year, one month after ESG local project term end. HMIS, APR, and CAPER reports will be utilized in the process. Participation with the consolidated plans of the City of Harrisburg is related to the ESG and CDBG release of funding request around February and CACH will participate in advising and ratifying the homeless portions of the City's consolidated plan at that time. Participation with the consolidated plans of the County of Dauphin is related to their ESG request for funding proposal in December and CACH will participate in advising and ratifying the homeless portions of the County's consolidated plan at that time. Point in Time counts are conducted the last Wednesday in January and CACH leads that effort at that time. Finally, CACH's efforts to increase its continuum with new and relevant members continues throughout the year.

The Coordinated Assessment will be developed and assessed throughout the grant period with meetings every month by CACH and the service delivery committee to determine its implementation and effectiveness.

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3. How will the requested funds improve or maintain the CoC's ability to evaluate the outcome of CoC and ESG projects?

The planning project enables CACH to improve accountability of HUD CoC and ESG projects by providing APR and performance monitoring on an annual basis. Projects can now be monitored at a local level and yearly which ensures that feedback is timely and relevant, and provide underperforming or noncompliant projects a reasonable length of time to progress and correct these issues. Enforcement can lead to the CoC not choosing to fund or ranking poor performing projects in lower tiers, and visa versa for higher performing evidence based ones.

The funds allow CACH to execute events that informs project outcomes, such as the annual PIT count with new reporting specifications each year including on hardest to poll populations such as unsheltered persons.

The grant will help CACH provide evaluative outcomes tools such as Coordinated Entry and Assessment and to expand HMIS as needed with new programs to achieve ending CH and family and youth homelessness by 2020.

CACH will seek volunteer and other resources to maintain its core planning and evaluation of its 10-Year Plan without this funding. CACH will also continue to look for additional planning funds to conduct planning activities outside the CoC's core planning activities.
