Emergency Night Shelter for Men

234 South Street, Harrisburg, PA

Emergency shelter on a nightly basis for men, ages 18 years and older. There are 40 cots are available each night; cots are assigned on a first-come, first served basis.

- Check-in begins at 7:30 p.m. and closes by 8:30 p.m., or when full capacity is reached. Lights out at 10:00 p.m. No meals or showers are available. Check-out time is 7:00 a.m.
- Breakfast is served 7:00 a.m. to 7:50 a.m. each morning, on-site at the DDB Soup Kitchen (basement floor)
- Once capacity is reached, Downtown Daily Bread will contact Susquehanna Harbor Safe Haven or Bethesda Mission to accommodate overflow guests.



Bethesda Mission

611 Reily Street, Harrisburg, PA

Male guests will be accepted when the wind-chill falls below 20 degrees, or when there is significant snowfall/freezing rain/sleet. Once daytime wind-chill temps rise above 20 degrees, guests will be asked to leave.

Overnight guests must sign in and then will be taken to the chapel to receive linens and a mat. Guests should be ready to sleep by 10:30pm.

- Doors open at 8 pm and will close at 9 pm. Guests coming in after 9 pm must register as a 20- day guest or they will not be accommodated.
- Once overnight winter shelter guests are signed in and our roll call and devotions are completed the guest will be taken to the chapel where they will receive a mat and linens. Guests should be ready to sleep by 10:30 pm, which is lights out.
- Guests are required to leave the building by 6:30 am, after putting their linens in laundry cart and putting away their mats.
- Guests who are found to be disrespectful to staff, other guests, the building, will be asked to leave and may be banned from the Mission.

Walk-in shelter for Women and non-binary individuals will be available on Dec. 20, 2019. **The shelter will be located at 216 State St., the Wesley House next to Grace United Methodist Church.**
